

Local Scholarships for Seniors @ Highland High School

Bea Mathison Memorial (\$400)

Due: May 11

Eligibility: This scholarship is for any Highland senior who post high school plans involve college and who exhibits leadership and involvement in school, work, and community. GPA is not a factor.

Requirements: Submit BEA Mathison Scholarship Application to school counselor by deadline.

Craigmont Chamber of Commerce (\$1,000)

Due: April 2

Eligibility: Open to Highland Senior with plans to attend college after high school. The criteria used to select the recipient of the Craigmont Chamber of Commerce Scholarship are academic excellence and volunteer work in their school, church, and community.

Requirements: Submit Chamber of Commerce Application by deadline to the Chamber of Commerce.

Craigmont June Picnic (\$1,200)

Due: April 6

Eligibility: Highland Senior. Involvement is school and community

Requirements: Submit June Picnic Scholarship Application by deadline to school counselor.

Dave Botnecht Memorial Lions Club (\$1,000)

Due: May 1

Eligibility: Open to a Highland Senior who demonstrates academic excellence and who has gone above and beyond as far as involvement in their school and community.

Requirements: Submit Lions Scholarship application and one letter of recommendation to the school counselor prior by the scholarship deadline.

Elsie Kinzer Memorial (\$200) “Prairie Imperial Bowl Scholarship”

Due: April 26

Eligibility: Highland senior, no GPA requirement, preference given to league bowlers.

Requirements: Submit Elsie Kinzer Scholarship application, transcript, and two letters of recommendation to the school counselor by scholarship deadline.

Grangeville Elks Lodge (\$250-500) “Teen of the Year Scholarship”

Due: March

Eligibility: Awarded to one boy and one girl in the 8 area schools. Involvement in school and community, leadership, scholastic achievement, and volunteer or paid work experience.

Requirements: Submit application with photo of yourself by deadline. Students may include letters of recommendation.

H.C. “Buck” Erickson Memorial (\$1,000)

Due: April 13

Eligibility: Have a passion and plan to attend college after high school.

Requirements: Submit application including essay on your passions in life and any achievements. Three letters of recommendation must also be included—one from the school faculty, one from a former or current employer and one from your parent. Send all materials with an attached cover letter to: H.C. “Buck” Memorial Scholarship, c/o Mike Erickson, 4147 Hwy 93, Filer, and ID 83328.

Highland Drama Club (\$200)

Due: May 1

Eligibility: Highland Senior involved in drama club or theatre while attending Highland. GPA not factor.

Requirements: Write an essay about how your involvement in drama at Highland has affected your goals and aspirations for the future.

Highland Education Association (\$100) “Gleaming Star Award”

Due: April 30

Eligibility: Highland senior, preference is given to students pursuing teaching or a related field. Highland teachers determine the winner of this scholarship based on the student’s demonstrated leadership, work experience, volunteer work and involvement in school activities.

Requirements: Complete application and 200 word essay on plans for the future. Also, include one letter of recommendation from someone outside your school or family.

Lewis/Clark Early Childhood Program (\$500)

Due: May 12

Eligibility: Must have attended Lewis County Early Childhood Program.

Requirements: Mail application, essay about goals for future education, and three letters of recommendation to The Lewis-Clark Early Childhood Program, 1816 18th Ave., Lewiston, Idaho 83501.

Lewis County 4-H Extension Office (\$200)

Due: April 15

Eligibility: Only seniors who have completed 3 years in 4-H in Lewis County and completed at least one 4-H project during their junior year in high school are eligible for this special 4-H scholarship

Requirements: Pick up and submit application at the Lewis County Extension Office in Nezperce.

Lewis County Cattle Association (\$500)

Due: April 15

Eligibility: High school senior planning to pursue college after high school. Parents must be members of the Idaho-Lewis County Cattle Association.

Requirements: Submit Application to the Idaho-Lewis County Cattle Association, Attention: Scholarship Committee, 414 Main Street, PO Box 37, Cottonwood, Idaho 83522.

Nezperce Garden Club (\$200)

Due: May 4

Eligibility: Senior at either Highland or Nezperce High School or homeschooler within Lewis County who plans to attend 2 or 4 year college in Idaho.

Requirements: Submit completed application, letter of recommendation, personal data sheet, and essay to school counselor by deadline.

Prairie Lodge-Masonic Temple (\$300)

Due: May 1

Eligibility: Open to Highland senior who demonstrates outstanding academic work in high school, as well as, participation in extracurricular activities. Masonic affiliation not required.

Requirements: Submit completed application and essay about your feelings of generosity to the school counselor by the scholarship deadline.

Primeland 6- (\$750)

Due: April 1

Eligibility: Enter field of college that could positively impact agriculture.

Requirements: No application. Just complete essay between 150-200 words in answer to this question: "As you pursue higher education, what is your choice of college major, and how will that field of study positively impact agriculture in the future?" Stephanie Hendren Memorial (\$500.00)

Due: May 3

Eligibility: Highland senior with plans to attend with plans to attend college, university, or vocational program after graduation.

Requirements: Application. 2-3 page essay, participation in extracurricular and volunteer activities. Preference given to student's pursuing medical programs of study.

Winchester Days Association (\$50)

Due: April 1

Eligibility: Senior at Highland High School who resides in the town of Winchester and has plans to attend college after high school.

Requirements: Contact school counselor at Highland for short application.
